Here is a bit of history that you may not have been aware of:

RECOGNITION OF JOSEPH FERDINAND BULLITSCHEK AS A REVOLUTIONARY WAR PATRIOT

The ceremony to celebrate the recognition of Joseph Ferdinand Bullitschek as a Revolutionary War Patriot was conducted by Robert E. Hampton at the Bolejack/Bolerjack Cemetery, Germanton, North Carolina on June 25, 2010. Robert is the son of Vance and Marjorie Hampton and the grandson of Stephen and Mary Agnes Bolejack.

Joseph's life and service were highlighted including his contribution to the cause of the American Revolution against the British. Since he was a Moravian, his contribution would have been in the form of lending logistic support to the cause in the form of supplies. Also, the brass wreath of the Sons of the American Revolution was placed on the grave. Bob dedicated the grave marker "to the glory of God and memory of Joseph Ferdinand Bullitschek, our beloved forefather and patriot of the American Revolution". (He is also listed as a patriot in the DAR.)

Bob concluded the service with the following statement: "If the past is indeed prologue, then a glimpse into the past can provide a source of wisdom and inspiration for the future. As we honor this patriot today, let us be mindful of his service to our nation, and let us rededicate ourselves to the principles for which Joseph held sacred."
